



The Richest Man in Babylon


by George S Clason

Told in a fable style, this story communicates the basics of wealth: saving, investing and borrowing.




Rich Dad, Poor Dad by Robert Kiyosaki

Fortunately there are awesome free services on offer, most of which involve the opportunity to talk to someone about your specific situation. Some agencies have qualifying criteria, so be sure to check you're eligible before you book in.

If you don't qualify for any of the above, another option is booking in for a free 'discovery session' with a financial planner. Most planners and advisors will offer a free 45-60 minute session, during which you can talk specifics about your situation.

If you are considering hiring a planner or advisor, make sure they are feeonly to reduce the potential for getting ripped off.
